### **Congressman Aids Veterans Returning with Disabilities**

HASTINGS, Minn.- June 23 (The Langenfeld Foundation)--The Langenfeld Foundation, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, is proud to announce a fundraiser banquet, to benefit veterans returning with disabilities from Iraq, Afghanistan, and other fields of operation. Congressman John Kline will be an "Honored Guest" and featured speaker during the evening program. Several other "Honored Guests" have been invited as well.

The fundraiser is set for Sunday, July 19, from 5:30-8:30 PM. It will be in Seton Hall, at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Church (the address is 2035-15<sup>th</sup> Street W., Hastings, MN 55033.)
